Opening of the Egyptian Cultural Educational Bureau after Renovation





Under the auspices of HE, Dr. Mohamad Ayman Ashour, Minister of Higher Education and Scientific Research, and with the presence of Ambassador Motaz Zahran, Ambassador of Egypt to the United States Of America, and Dr. Sherif Saleh, Head of the Sector of Cultural Affairs and Missions, the official opening of Egyptian Cultural and Educational Bureau was held on January 4th, 2024 after the completion the building's renovation.

An Introductory lecture was presented by Danial Pizza, the chief curator at the National Post Museum in Washington DC, who shed light on the importance of the Collection of Egyptian stamps at the National Post Museum. Dr. Heba Saad the Cultural Attaché presented an overview of the history of Post in Egypt and the development of the Egyptian stamps.



The exhibition highlighted the importance of the Egyptian stamps as an archive of the history of Egypt by commemorating its political, scientific, cultural, and sportive events.








ECEB Book Club
